**Valley View Residential Care:** Licensed by the state of Missouri, Valley View is a 119-unit residential care facility II. It offers a 24-hour nursing staff, regular housekeeping service, three meals a day and a full calendar of activities.

**Valley View Memory Care Assisted Living:** Licensed by the state of Missouri, this assisted living unit provides a comfortable – yet secure – home away from home and a full range of services that have been carefully planned to provide a supportive environment for residents with Alzheimer's disease and other memory-related diseases. It offers 24-hour nursing care, supervision and support staff; private and semi-private; secured entrances and monitoring systems in resident rooms; and more.

**Village Care Center:** The Village Care Center is a 430-bed, freestanding skilled nursing facility. It provides 24-hour licensed nursing services, a 36-bed Alzheimer's unit, state-of-the-art rehabilitation services and a Medicare-certified post-acute unit.

**Village Hospice of John Knox Village:** Village Hospice provides comfort-oriented services to individuals with life-limiting illnesses, especially those in the final stages of their lives. The agency has a philosophy based on providing compassionate care and comfort to those in need and is dedicated to providing physical, emotional and spiritual support to patients and their families. The agency is licensed and certified by the state of Missouri and Medicare.
