Fitness Program

The Village's fitness program is designed to support the overall wellness of residents. Exercise and movement have proven to be critical in seniors' overall health. The fitness program includes state-of-the art fitness equipment in the two fitness centers on campus, two indoor pools, and one outdoor pool as well as a variety of classes and personal or semi-personal training. Together, residents and the fitness team work to achieve positive outcomes by supporting residents in becoming healthier and stronger.

Chaplaincy Program
